CLUBS

2. **The Ndanifor Dance and Theatre Troupe (NDTT):** This comprises of young technicians who use traditional dances and theatre to spread the message of environmental and cultural conservation, use local materials to produce goods, and help young people start up businesses for self employment.



3. Better World Children's Environmental Club (BWCEC):

Provide children between the ages of 6 –14years to learn about and take care of the environment, enabling them to grow up as responsible and environmentally aware citizens.
